

Grammar Rules: When Explaining Goes Wrong

Gerunds

- Gerunds are formed by adding an "ing" to a verb
- Gerunds function as a noun
- •Watch out for present participles, they look like gerunds
- •Gerunds often occur when there are two or more verbs
- Some verbs can be followed by a gerund or an infinitive
- Some verbs can only be followed by gerunds
- •Some verbs can only be followed by infinitives
- •Some verbs can be followed by either a gerund or infinitive
- Gerunds sometimes follow prepositions
- Infinitives can also follow prepositions
- •Many gerunds are preceded by "go"
- •Gerunds are generally not plural
- •Gerunds can be subjects, subject complements, or objects
